Wildlife Walk - January 2022

The first wildlife walk of 2022 took place on Wednesday 26th January 2022. Overall, a fairly quiet day in the Park but a few of the resident birds were quite active, with plenty of Blue Tits and Robins in the hedgerows and a nice flock of Goldfinch feeding on the alders along the boardwalk. One of the highlights for me was seeing 3 Greenfinches along the road to the car park – we only saw 1 Greenfinch in the whole of 2021, so we are off to a good start this year. A good record for this time of year was a Blackcap, heard singing by Stuart, near the picnic tables. Bit early for attracting a female but practise never goes to waste. This bird is likely to be over-wintering in the UK and will not be an early migrant. There were good numbers of birds at the lake, including Black Headed Gull, Moorhen, Coot and Mallard but the Canada Geese were absent again. A nice spot at the end was a Jay that we nearly ignored as a Wood Pigeon; very nice as it sat in a tree posing for us.
