'Let's Go Fly a Kite'

There was a wonderful turn out at the Kite Festival again this year. The event really does appeal to all ages from 4 day old Georgia on her first trip to the park, to spritely 95 year old Colin who is our kite making expert.



We were so lucky with the weather and although rain was forecast it managed to hold off and at times the sun broke through. This meant the beautifully polished and maintained classic vehicles on display remained pristine. The Essex Kite Club would have liked more wind so they could fly their large and magnificent kites. However, the hundred and fifty children who came and made their kites were not worried by the vagaries of the weather. Plastic, sticks, sticky tape, bridles and tails were carefully constructed to produce, not the most beautiful but very effective kites. With a few words of instruction from the experts they soon had their very own kites in the air. For those who like to be creative (and this included adults and children) there were lots of opportunities to cut, glue and colour to make their own art work.



Helping the children make their kites is very labour intensive and I would like to thank Sue, Michelle, Mike, Jane, Maureen, Netty, Pat, Gill, Morris and Colin for helping the committee so every child was able to go home with a kite they had helped build. A special thank you must go to the Essex Kite Club for the kite material and for teaching us how to tie a bowline, and Craig and the South Eastern Vintage and Classic Vehicle Club for a wonderful display of tenderly cared for vehicles.

'Contain your delight'



For many years, visitors to The Wick Country Park could hardly fail to notice the rusty red steel container in the car park. At best it might be described as utilitarian, at worst an eyesore! All this especially when compared with our lovely Pavilion!

For some time now certain members of our Committee have prayed that it might one day be “prettied” up a bit. Great hopes were held out having seen that a similar container at Wat Tyler Country Park had been converted to public toilets, complete with softwood cladding and.....a *green roof*!

Such things actually have a very old pedigree dating from almost the Stone Age when roofs to dwellings were often of straw thatch or turf, both of which tended to attract growth of mosses and grasses.

A green roof does what it says on the box – on top of the waterproof membrane is a root barrier, topped with compost sown with various plants and grasses.

This has the following advantages:

- It shields the waterproof membrane from the heat of the sun and the cold of a winter's night
- It shield the membrane from the harmful effects of the sun's ultra-violet rays
- It provides a colourful and eco-friendly “hat” over the building, and
- It provides a habitat for birds, insects and small mammals.

Last year our Chairperson got really excited to hear that we might get a grant for the work. After many hopes were raised, and then dashed, we heard this year that Veolia were going to fund the lion's share of the job from their environmental fund, with the rest made up by the Friends!

Visitors since a few weeks ago can now marvel at the change in appearance of our container! Apart from the vertical timber cladding and green roof, one can see, fixed to the sides, a variety of artificial habitats for wasps, bees and other insects.

The work was ably co-ordinated by Basildon Council, and carried out by the local firm of The Grass Roof Company of Horndon-on-the-Hill. On his site visit, owner John Little took the time to explain the “green” construction to our Wick Weeders, how the work would be done and what it would look like when completed. A big thank you to him and his staff for getting on with the job so quickly!



So our ugly frog of a container has at last been transformed in to a handsome “green” prince!
